The text of the *Pesach Seder* is written in the *Haggadah*.

The symbolic names of each section was composed over 850 years ago probably by *Rashi - Rabbi Shlomo Yitzchaki (ben Yitzchak) (1040-1105)*.

The ORDER of the *Seder* is:

| <i>Kaddesh</i> | Recite the Kiddush. |
| <i>Urechatz</i> | Wash the hands before eating <i>Karpas</i> . |
| <i>Karpas</i> | Eat a vegetable dipped in salt water. |
| <i>Yachatz</i> | Break the middle <i>matzah</i> and hide half for Afikoman. |
| <i>Maggid</i> | Tell the <i>Pesach</i> story. |
| <i>Rachtzah</i> | Wash the hands before eating <i>matzah</i> . |
| <i>Motzi Matzah</i> | Say Hamotzi and the special <i>bracha</i> for the <i>matzah</i> and then eat the <i>matzah</i> . |
| <i>Maror</i> | Eat the bitter herbs. |
| <i>Korech</i> | Eat a sandwich of <i>matzah</i> and <i>marror</i> . |
| <i>Shulchan Orech</i> | Serve and eat a festive meal. |
| <i>Tzafun</i> | Eat the <i>Afikoman</i> . |
| <i>Barech</i> | Recite <i>Birchat Hamazon</i> (Grace after Meals). |
| <i>Hallel</i> | Recite the <i>Hallel</i> (Psalms of praise). |
| <i>Nirtzah</i> | Pray that <i>Hashem</i> accepts our <i>mitzva</i> . |






